Working Livery Agreement

### £105 per week

The horse is shared by the Riding Academy and the student, they can be used by the school for riding or training lessons up to twice a day for a maximum of five days. The student can care for their horse (AM + PM) and ride up to twice a week.

Procedure for all new horse arrivals:

- All horses will undergo a health check upon arrival, physio assessment and saddle check within the first month at cost to the student.
- Your horse may be subject to a quarantine period that will be discussed prior to arrival.
- All horses will be wormed in accordance with the yard worming programme.
- Your horse's passport must remain with Leweston whilst your horse is at livery with us. This is a legal requirement.
- Vaccination record must be up to date (Equine Influenza and Tetanus and for international horses EHV). Please note that the primary (first two vaccinations) must have been completed 7 days PRIOR to arrival, also your horse should not require to be vaccinated within 7 days of arriving. Most UK show centres require Flu vaccinations to be updated every 6 months.
- Please inform us of the date when the horse was last shod or is due to be shod.
- Please inform us of your horse's current bedding and feeding regime including supplements and forage (hay/haylage)
- Tack must be safe and well-fitting; this will be checked before the horse is first ridden.
- All horses must have Third Party Insurance and it is strongly advised you have full cover for Veterinary and Dental fees, a copy of the insurance cover must be handed in on arrival.
- Please inform of us of any specific behaviour or personality traits we need to be aware of (ie biting, kicking, head-shy, sensitive, weaves or crib-bites).

#### FEES AND PAYMENT

- Livery fees for the term must be paid in advance at a cost £105 per week. An invoice will be raised by the Fees Department and shared with parents.
- Any transport costs must be booked and paid for in advance.
- A half term's notice must be given for the horse to stay during the long school holidays (Christmas, Easter, Summer). Holiday livery is charged as Full Livery £235 per week and will be invoiced by the school.
- A terms written notice needs to be given if you no longer wish your horse to stay in Working Livery.
- Any professional fees (Vet, Farrier, Shoeing, Dental and Physio) will be re-charged half-termly and must be paid within 7 days.

## ADDITIONAL COSTS

When incurred, the following additional costs will be recharged on a termly basis.

Parents will be notified of any additional costs over the value of  $\pounds 100$  prior to the cost being incurred.

- All instruction costs by the student owner, either with a Leweston coach or specific privately arranged coaches.
- Transport to training or competitions.
- Competition entry fees.
- Any school organised training sessions, clubs, visits, talks and workshops.
- Clipping, trimming, mane and tail pulling.
- Wormers/faecal counts
- Any required supplements, first-aid or veterinary supplies.
- Saddlery and tack repairs or replacement kit.

- Bridle number
- Plaiting kit
