

This year we are working towards the **CAFOD Live Simply Award**. This award is inspired by the words of Pope Francis who asks, **"What kind of world do we want to leave to those who come after us, to children who are now growing up?"** The **Live Simply Award** is an opportunity for Leweston, as a Catholic community, to answer the call to care for our common home and stand in solidarity with our sisters and brothers around the world.

It is a school wide project that has 9 separate elements looking at Global, Local and School based activities. Each will reflect the **7 principles of Catholic Social Teaching**. Below are details of each principle and the projects we are working on throughout the year.

## 1. Human Dignity

We believe that every person is created in the image of God and that all human life is sacred. We believe in the dignity of each person.

This year we are taking part in the Big Lent Walk 2024 to raise funds and awareness of the work of CAFOD. This will be a whole school event and we will invite parents and parishioners to join us.

This year we are competing in a community event, the annual Dragon Boat Racing at the Sherborne Fair. This will raise money for the Sherborne Food Bank.

#### 4. Rights and Responsibilities

We believe every person has a fundamental right to life and a right to those things required for human decency. We all have duties and responsibilities—to one another, to our families, and to the larger society to protect these rights.

This year we are holding 3 collections of food & toiletries for the Sherborne Food Bank.

#### 5. Option for the poor

We believe in prioritising the women, men and children most vulnerable to extreme poverty and injustice. "The spirit of the Lord is on me, for he has anointed me to bring the good news to the afflicted. He has sent me... to let the oppressed go free." Luke 4:18

This year we are supporting our sister school, Jana Jyoti, in Nepal. Profits from Tuck Shop fund the sponsorship of a student in Nepal. A group of students visited Nepal in October 2023 to work on a project in the village. We are providing Jana Jyoti with school uniform, sports equipment and raising funds for agriculture items.

#### 6. The dignity of work

We believe in every person's right to participate in the decisions that affect their own lives.

This year we are raising awareness of the Cafod 'Fix the Food System Campaign' across the school community. Students complete a creative project based on Step Up to the Plate to raise money for CAFOD. CAFOD lunches: Harvest Fast, Ash Wednesday, Lent Fast are simple meals, we donate the money saved to CAFOD.

#### 7. Stewardship

We believe that care for our common home is vital for the common good of all people. We believe a true ecological approach is a social approach. We are to be protectors of creation and of one another.
